During the off season, the club Executive works hard to plan for the upcoming season and this year was no different. We planned an exciting and busy event schedule which your Executive members were looking forward to presenting at the spring AGM. Unfortunately, COVID-19 made it impossible to hold the AGM safely. Karolyn Francis, our amazing treasurer, ensures us that our financial picture has not changed significantly since our fall meeting so the club will continue to operate based on those reports.

Now on to our events. In recognition of the late start to the season, the club's Executive has decided to postpone the May 31 Sailpast and to cancel the June 6 Let's Talk Sailing event.

We are pleased to announce the return of the Club Championship Trophy Racing Series. Over the years the number of races had increased drastically making it a huge commitment to participate. We've decided to return to a schedule to a spring and fall race series.. Each series consists of one long-distance race and two short-course races. The schedule currently has a skipper's meeting prior to each race but this may need to happen via email and the club bulletin board due to physical distancing restrictions. These decisions will be made at our monthly Executive meeting currently being held via Zoom on the first Wednesday of the month. Email correspondence keep the Executive in touch and emergency meetings are held as needed.
